This Christmas Classic, penned in 1945 and first sung by Nat King Cole, as well as so many others since, conjures up what might be for many, an idyllic vision of Christmas. Friends and family gathered in harmony to celebrate, a real fire bringing warmth and light to the room, a table ladened with rich indulgent food and a stack of tantalising presents lying under the Christmas tree waiting to be opened. It's a picture of a traditional Christmas which can bring a warm glow to our hearts when we hear those first violin strains of the song. Christmas is a time for rejoicing with those we love, as well as with those we might find a bit more of a challenge! Christmas is a time when we can put aside our differences and unite in our celebration with one another.

At Christmas we celebrate the birth of a tiny baby in the town of Bethlehem, Palestine, over 2000 years ago. His mother Mary and her fiancé Joseph were refugees, having been forced to leave the familiarity of their hometown on account of a Roman census. No room for them in a warm cosy inn. Instead a cold, dirty cattle shed would be the place for this baby to enter the world. Yet, his first lullabies were sung by angels, his first visitors humble shepherds, his first gifts gold, Cont'd...... frankincense and myrrh. Baby Jesus, God's own son gifted to humanity to bring light and peace and comfort and joy and hope in places of darkness: in our hearts, in our lives, in the world.

As we approach this Christmas, hopefully we might find some way to see and hear again the story of God's greatest gift to us, his son Jesus. Maybe at a school Nativity Play or a Crib Service, a Carol Service or Midnight Mass at our local church. The details of our Christmas celebrations at St Mary's Church are enclosed and we would love to see you at anytime.

The Holy Land, Jesus' place of birth is, as I write, once again mired in terrible ,conflict and suffering, with many innocents paying such a high price and, for some, the ultimate price, because of war and aggression. It might for some, feel selfish to celebrate as we do, with such extravagance, when there are so many people in the world who are cold and hungry and despairing and grieving and living in darkness with little hope. Perhaps amidst the Christmas frenzy and fun of choosing and wrapping presents, planning menus, writing cards to those we have not seen for a while, we might pause.

Pause.... and light a candle.

Pause.... and say a prayer for God's peace and light to come upon all conflict areas Pause.... and give thanks for our blessings.

Pause.... and consider if it is in our gift to make a donation to one of those charities who desperately need our help at this time to bring some joy to others this Christmas.

After a short service at the War Memorial to lay wreaths the Royal British Legion and uniformed organisations joined the congregation in the church for a moving Service of Remembrance.





One of the wonderful things about leading St Mary's Primary School is the close links that we enjoy with St Mary's Church. One of the most important factors for me when I applied to be Headteacher of St Mary's School was the fact that it is a Church school and in my first weeks in post, back in the Summer term 2022, I met with Rev Ruth to discuss how we could strengthen the links between church and school.We are

very fortunate that Rev Ruth comes to visit us in school once a week, on a Tuesday morning, to lead our Collective Worship, which in addition to her being one of our school governors, makes her very much part of our school community. We also greatly value the opportunity that we have to visit St Mary's Church for school services during the course of the year. Currently we hold services in church on the last day of each term, we have a Harvest Festival Service in October and a Key Stage 2 Carol Service in December. Our End of Term and Leavers' Service in July is particularly special, because following the service the Year 6 leavers remain at the church, after the other children have returned to school, and there is a Leavers' Lunch for the

pupils and parents in the St Michael's Room. We also valued being involved in the North Mymms Arts Festival which was held in September, when

some of our Year 5s and 6s took part in the poetry hour. We are also looking forward to

contributing to the Christmas Tree Festival and our children regularly contribute to the Hope Railings outside the church.

All these events make us feel very much part of the St Mary's Church community and we are always so grateful for the warmth of the welcome that we receive.
