The TV is full with ads for the Autumn line-up of new programmes about to begin.



Here at St Mary's church, and echoed throughout the UK, we mark the passing of the seasons with special annual services held in the next few months –

- Harvest Festival Ist October
- ♦ All Souls 29<sup>th</sup> October
- Remembrance Sunday 12th November
- ♦ Christ the King 26<sup>th</sup> November

and the following week we enter the season of Advent and then, of course, the culmination of it all, Christmas. But before we get to Christmas, we enjoy the Autumn months, with the crisp weather and magnificent displays of colourful foliage.

We prepare to decorate our church and give thanks for the harvests, in thanks to God for all he provides for us, with opportunities for people to come and share their bounty with tinned goods and dried foods that we in turn pass onto the Hatfield Food Bank. Do join us as we say thank you for all that is produced for us, especially as we live in a rural area and see farmers go about their daily duties of supply the raw ingredients to sustain us.

The Bible contains a letter to the early church in Ephesus and the writer St. Paul encourages us all to live our lives in an attitude of thankfulness. It is hard and takes Cont'd......

....a lot of discipline and requires effort. If you're feeling grouchy for no good reason, try smiling - the physical act of smiling makes you feel more cheerful whether you want to or not.

We acknowledge that many people are worrying over the current cost of living crisis and it is affecting us in many different ways. If you are struggling with life then please do get in touch and share your burdens with us. All of our struggles and sufferings matter to God, however small they are. St. Paul understood that if we can learn to be positive and thankful during the good times, then that will help to sustain us through the bad times. He was in prison when he wrote to the Ephesians. Being thankful did not diminish his hardship, but it did help him to endure it.

Each new day brings with it a new beginning and a challenge. So, I will leave you with an Autumn challenge, a challenge to be thankful. To make the effort to see the positive in a situation rather than the downside. Instead of moaning, to give thanks instead. And I think that if we can do that, we will discover that whatever life may bring, it will be the better for having consciously tried to live it in an attitude of thankfulness.

Over the years St Mary's has supported many charities through its Away Giving and running events to raise money for various charitable organisations. However our giving doesn't aways come in the form of money. We have a group of dedicated knitters too who use their time and talents to enrich their giving. Recently the group


