Rev Penny writes ...

In our last Newsletter Rev Ruth asked: "Are we *there yet?*" I'm pleased to say: "Yes we *are!*" Although there are some caveats and we should not be complacent or naïve so as not to recognise that, as we head towards the colder months, some restrictions on our way of living may yet be re-imposed.



But for now - it is Summer! A time for sunshine, more care-free days, beaches, fish and chip suppers and ice creams. For some lucky people, the prospect of a holiday is now very tangible.

It seems that Jesus did not take a traditional holiday as such, but he often took breaks away from the demands, the hustle and bustle and frenzy that was frequently going on around him. Jesus seemed to love a mountain-break – going off by himself to solitary places where he could rest and recuperate, listen to God his Father speak, freed from the noise of the eager crowds and even from his trusted friends, his apostles. And Jesus loved a break by the Sea of Galilee too - walking on sandy shores, beside a sparkly sea, waves crashing gently, glorious, fantastic red-gold evening sunsets. One of my favourite stories about Jesus is of his post-resurrection Bar-B-Q picnic on the shore of Lake Galilee, when he surprised his friends with a breakfast of warm bread and fish. "Come and eat with me" he said (John 21). And they all sat down together on the sand, around a fire. There was no teaching or instruction – words were not required. They were simply present to one another, Jesus with his friends.

Our lives can be busy and full of clutter which can leave us feeling quite exhausted, run ragged and weary. Jesus invites each of us to come and eat with him, to rest awhile with him. Rest doesn't necessarily have to mean inactivity, but rather rest with Jesus can mean feeling calm, peaceful, and enjoying the refreshment of our souls which comes from being with the one who loves us so much.

So, over the Summer can I invite you to take some time to enjoy nature – the woods, fields, streams, lakes, mountains, beaches, gardens. Listen, look, smell, feel, taste the good things given to us in God's beautiful Creation. And while you are doing this, quietly ask Jesus to come and join you. Sit, walk, lie down in his presence, feel his peace wash over you, embrace his restoring power. Just be with Jesus –and allow him to lift you up and fill you with his joy and peace.
